Key Information:

- Undergraduate degrees in France, known as Licence degrees, take three years to complete and correspond to a UK Bachelors.
- You'll use the national online platform <u>Parcoursup</u> (in French) to enroll. Registrations typically close in late March or early April for courses starting in the autumn.
- Be prepared to provide transcripts of your past qualifications and proof of your language proficiency where required, as well as a CV and cover letter. You may also be invited to an interview or have to sit an entrance exam.
- For international undergraduate students, the tuition fee in France is currently €2,770 per year.
