**Country:** New Zealand

#### **Key Information:**

- Just like in the UK, you can study for a Bachelors, Masters or a
  Doctorate at Kiwi institutions. All qualifications in the country are
  listed on the New Zealand Qualifications and Credentials Framework
  (NZQCF).
- The academic year begins in late February or early March and finishes in November (spring).
- You can explore the range of institutions at <u>Study with New Zealand</u> New Zealand Universities.
- Universities set their own fees and tuition costs, which vary depending on the course and the institution. You'll need to check with your individual university to find out more.
