• Sweden is home to 39 universities. Two are insight the QS World

- University Rankings 2023 top 100. These are KTH Royal Institute of Technology, in 89th position, and Lund University in 95th.
- Programmes are offered at two main types of institution in Sweden: universities (universitet) provide degrees at Bachelors, Masters and PhD level and university colleges (högskola) offer courses at undergraduate and Masters level only. Despite the difference, universities are considered no more prestigious than university colleges.
- The Swedish academic calendar runs from August to mid-January (autumn semester) and mid-January to the beginning of June (spring semester).
